- Fourteen identified species of salmon are endangered.
- Understanding Alternative Number 2 pertaining to property within the Urban Renewal District in the Old Town area. Is vacant and undeveloped property currently not in the floodplain affected by this?
- Hypothetically, if Alternative Number 1 is adopted and someone wants to obtain a permit to build on an undeveloped piece of property, what is being looked at?

- Staff is not recommending Alternative Number 1. Prohibiting development or a moratorium would be a very serious thing.
- Understanding the Federal term for development is any human made impact to the property.

Staff recommendation is a motion to direct staff to notify FEMA by the December 1, 2024 deadline, that the City of Florence selects PICM Options #2 and 3 AND approves staff working on PICM Option #2 to possibly move forward with the adoption of both a permit-by-permit compliance evaluation process AND Option #3 a possible amendment to the Florence Municipal Code, Title 4 Chapters 4 and 6 and Title 10 Chapters 7 and 19 and to the Florence Comprehensive Plan as applicable and direct staff to prepare a tailored version of updated 2024 FEMA Model Ordinance as warranted.

Discussion: The City Council discussed...

- Clarifying Options #2 and #3 combined into one recommendation, understanding when Option #2 is used and when is Option #3 used.
- Understanding the difference if someone chooses a permit versus the code.

- Understanding that if no option is selected, the default option will be permit-by-permit.
- Clarifying that I have an interest in this since I own properties in Old Town that this affects. Clarifying if I apply for a permit tomorrow, the existing rules would apply.

Staff discussed...

- My understanding from attending the Work Shops, the direction FEMA is suggesting, if you have a lot of properties in the floodplain, a model ordinance is easier for a jurisdiction to navigate; if you do not have very many properties in the floodplain, a permit-bypermit option would be a better option
- If you do a permit-by-permit, you do all the study that there is no net effect done by analysis and hydrology studies on the property.
- It is correct if no option is selected, it will default to permit-by-permit.
- Both options will require some amendment to City code.
- Beginning in January, the City will be required to report to FEMA all development activities occurring in the flood zone.
