#### **ART MAINTENANCE**

#### From Public Works Director Mike Miller:

The art piece had slipped again due to design flaw and the all-thread rod pulled through the silicone caulking that the artist recommended when it was repaired last time. The issue is that as the art piece spins/turns it travels down the all-thread rod, which cuts into the caulking. The single nut that supposed to keep the shape centered is not locked and also travels.

This time we are going to cover the all thread with a piece of PEX pipe and install washers to prevent it from traveling down the rod. As the artist mentioned in December, the newer models have a rod running through the middle of the wood panels, eliminating the metal thread which tears the black silicon. I believe the fix that my staff has/will complete will extend the life of the artwork, allow it to continue to spin, but not wear through the silicon or continue to move down the rod.
