
Quests are...

- Brain-child of Cait Goodwin who learned about Quests via the Valley Quest program in Vermont
- Suitable for all ages, no smartphone or GPS required
- Exploration at one's own pace

Box Monitor: OSU Precollege Programs

This Quest is located in and around the Kelley Engineering Center (KEC) at Oregon State University in Corvallis. Follow the directions and collect the letter clues to fill the numbered squares on page 242. At the end of your walk, use the clues to locate the hidden Quest Box. Sign the log book, stamp your page and return the box to its hiding place for the next person to find. Good luck! Approximate time: 15 minutes.

Art can be anywhere. It can have many faces. Sculpture, paint, and music are in our public spaces.

In this OSU building, you may be surprised to learn, both art and hidden clues lie at every turn.



Start outside the south entrance of KEC on Campus Way.
Look up for the name of the man who gave \$20 million away.

Martin Kelley was an engineer. He wore a bow tie well. His funds helped build KEC So students could excel.

Please take the very last letter of the building name, and write it in square 1.
You've now begun the game!

Look inside, to the left, for pictures of alternative energy.

The art is inspired by neo-cubism.

Meanwhile, the child wants to play."4


Proceed to where art takes a tasty, culinary angle. With all your letters collected, a word you'll disentangle.

- Rollout party, future celebrations & art rotations, box with copies strategically placed?




The Focus

- Book released: Summer 2023



Where Are We Today?

- 88 people have completed the Quest!
- Log book was filled as of October 2024 and new log not placed until January, so number could be higher?
- New log book does not ask what they learned.
- Recommend "schedule" for box checking/reporting.



Updates & Changes

- New book releases April 2025
- Some changes made to handle changes along route
- Biggest change was at mural (artist name no longer visible) so pulling letter from different location on the piece.
- Since there was a gap in art being visible during rotation, note placed at start that some art could be missing during changes.


