- **Note:** Written comments received at least 2 hours prior to the meeting will be distributed to the Committee, posted to the City of Florence website, and made part of the record.
- 2. Verbal Testimony: Citizens wishing to express their views to the Committee may participate in the meeting inperson or via GoToWebinar. To do so, please complete a speaker's card online at https://www.ci.florence.or.us/bc-pac/public-arts-committee-speaker's card online at https://www.ci.florence.or.us/bc-pac/public-arts-committee-speakers-card at least 1 hour prior to the meeting. City staff will then contact the speaker to let them know the process to participate in the meeting.
 - a. Public Comments on items not on the agenda: General public comments (on items not on the agenda) will be allowed at each Committee meeting during the public comment agenda item. Comments will be limited to three (3) minutes per person, with a maximum of 15 minutes for all items. In practicality, this means no more than five individuals will be allowed to comment verbally. There is no limit on written public comments.
 - b. Public Comments on Action Items: Public Comments will be allowed on each action item on the Committee agenda. Verbal comments will be allowed on action items after staff has given their report and have allowed time for initial Committee questions. Comments will be limited to three (3) minutes per person, with a maximum of 15 minutes for all comments on each action item. In practicality, this means no more than five (5) individuals will be allowed to comment verbally. There is no limit on written public comments.

Dear Public Arts Committee members,

We are gathering as a committee on Monday, August 26, 2024, for our regular monthly meeting at 4 p.m. at Florence City Hall.



We will be meeting in the City Council Chambers, either in person or through the GoToWebinar platform.

The meeting will begin with our Continuing Education presentation from Dianna Allison, who got the chance to drive to the South Coast. She made time to stop at the Coos Art Museum and a museum in Gold Beach.

Then we are going to delve into something that is a usual part of our duties, and is a big commitment. That's right, as a committee we will be initiating **Art Exposed Old Town 2025-2027**. We will be talking about the eight locations for our Rotating Outdoor Art Gallery, mostly on Bay Street, the historic pieces we have placed there, and what could be possible moving forward. Staff will then present a 6-month timeline, which encompasses two months to open and close our Call for Artists and time to review the applications, select finalists, and then vote on locations. We will also talk about the timeline for removing the current round of Art Exposed in Old Town.

Good afternoon, Florence Public Arts Committee,

Earlier this year, 2022-2024 Art Exposed Old Town artist Kirk Seese reached out to the City of Florence about removing his two pieces, "Icosahedron" and "Pluma Sculptura: The Feather," a little bit early. The current round of Art Exposed in Historic Old Town Florence is supposed to conclude this fall. However, we hadn't landed on a day so I had not yet reported this back to you as our Public Art Program managers.

Yesterday evening, after 5 pm, Kirk emailed the City that he was actually in Oregon for an art install and would be able to work with us to remove his pieces either last night or today. In a brief conference call between myself, City Manager Erin Reynolds, and our Public Works Director Mike Miller, we agreed that he should be able to take his art. Kirk then removed his pieces early this morning.

I want to assure you that Kirk appreciated our placements of both "Icosahedron" at the Maple Street Plaza and "Pluma Sculptura: The Feather" in our Siuslaw River Interpretive Site. He said that "The Feather," in particular, was probably his favorite art placement location of his entire career. He said he intends to apply to any of our future calls (and was actually a runner up for Art Exposed ReVision Florence) and is willing to hop onto a Gotowebinar to talk with the Committee about his art and experience working with us.

I also want to let you know that the City was shocked about the speed of removal. We regret that we did not get the chance to communicate with all of you that this could happen earlier than the other pieces are decommissioned. I'm truly sorry that things happened that fast! The timeline was between 5 pm last night and 7:30 am today.

We will be looking at project timelines in our August 26 meeting, and that will include wrapping up 2022-2024 Art Exposed Old Town and preparing for our next call for art. We will also talk about what we want to do with the two now-vacant Art Exposed locations, especially as they are part of our Public Art Quest, <u>https://www.ci.florence.or.us/bc-pac/florence-public-art-quest</u>.

Thank you all for your understanding.

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Art Exposed Old Town 2025-2027 Potential Timeline 1 – 6 months from Launch to Installation City of Florence Public Arts Committee

Phases of Art Exposed: - Six- to 10-month process

- 1. Pre-Planning: It takes one month to introduce the project to the Public Arts Committee and approve and open the Call for Art
- 2. Open Call: The call for art is open for 2 months. (We attempted 6 weeks but did not receive enough applications)
- 3. Decision: It takes one month to introduce and review the applications one subcommittee meeting and one public meeting and then one month to vote, often at 5:30 p.m.
- 4. Coordination: It takes one month to 1. Notify the finalists and confirm availability 2. Enact the contracts
 a. Consider sending certified mail to artists/ with tracking numbers
- 5. Installation: This could take one month or more, but we will try to tighten things up. It helps that we have no plans to expand our number of Art Exposed plinths.
