UPDATED PUBLIC MEETINGS PROCEDURES – COVID-19

Given executive orders from Governor Brown concerning COVID-19 and social distancing requirements, the City of Florence has established temporary procedures for public meetings in order to protect our volunteers, public and staff.

In person attendance is not allowed at Transportation Committee (TC) meetings.

Expressing Views to the Transportation Committee: Citizens wishing to express their views to the TC may do so in both written and verbal formats.

- 1. <u>Written Testimony:</u> Citizens wishing to express their views to the TC are encouraged to submit written testimony in one of the following ways:
 - a. Submit written comments via email to Senior Planner: Roxanne.Johnston@ci.florence.or.us
 - b. Mail written comments to Florence City Hall, Attn: Transportation Committee, 250 Hwy 101, Florence, OR 97439
 - c. Drop off written comments to the City of Florence drop box located at Florence City Hall (250 Hwy 101) to the right of the main entrance.
 - ** Note: Written comments received at least 2 hours prior to the meeting (October 14, 2021 at 12:30 p.m.) will be distributed to the TC, posted to the City of Florence website, and made part of the record.
- 2. <u>Verbal Testimony:</u> Citizens wishing to express their views to the TC may participate in the meeting via GotoWebinar. To do so, please complete a speaker's card October 14, 2021 at 11:30 p.m.). City staff will then contact the speaker to let them know the process to participate in the meeting.
 - a. <u>Public Comments on items not on the agenda:</u> General public comments (on items not on the TC agenda) will be allowed at each TC meeting during the public comment agenda item. Comments will be limited to three (3) minutes per person, with a maximum of 15 minutes for all items. In practicality, this means no more than five individuals will be allowed to comment verbally. There is no limit on written public comments.
 - b. <u>Public Comments on Action Items:</u> Public Comments will be allowed on each action item on the TC agenda. Verbal comments will be allowed on action items after staff has given their report and have allowed time for initial Committee questions. Comments will be limited to three (3) minutes per person, with a maximum of 15 minutes for all comments on each action item. In practicality, this means no more than five (5) individuals will be allowed to comment verbally. There is no limit on written public comments.
